
## GBTA-WI President - Emily Wright, Fox World Travel

winning some pretty fantastic items. Thank you to all of **YOU** who donated to the Silent Auction, without your support and generous donations the event wouldn't be possible.


# GBTA Leadership Conference & Chapter Presidents Meeting: 1/29-31/2018


